

“Potty Trained” Policy

We are so happy to have your child in our school and look forward to getting to know them this year.

As stated in our school handbook, it is our policy that your child is required to be potty trained. This policy is in place for many reasons, one being that frequent accidents distract from our learning environment taking time away from your child’s school day.

Although we are happy to help zip and button pants, your child should also be able to maneuver clothing, as well as wiping and washing hands on their own. Our goal is to partner with you as you teach your child how to accomplish independent, successful restroom skills.

We understand that some accidents are normal with children this age and do give them grace. However, frequent accidents are an indication that your child is not fully potty trained. If we see a pattern of frequent accidents, you will be called to come to the school and change your child’s clothing.

If your child is unable to potty train successfully, you will be called for a conference to discuss a new course of action.
